This letter is to confirm our understanding of the terms and objectives of our tax services engagement and to clarify the nature and extent of the tax services to be provided.

We will prepare the federal and requested state income tax returns for calendar year 2020 solely for filing with the Internal Revenue Service. We will also prepare, at your request, any gift tax returns that may be necessary. Our work is not intended to benefit or influence any third party, either to obtain credit or for any other purpose.
